PURPOSE

This advice letter is filed in compliance with Decision No. ("D.") 25-01-036, adopted on January 30, 2025, which resolves GSWC's 2023 General Rate Case (A.23-08-010). GSWC is seeking to implement the 2025 water rates in its Region 1 CSAs, effective February 1, 2025, as set forth in D.25-01-036.

BACKGROUND

Ordering Paragraph No. ("OP") 2 of D.25-01-036 adopts the Settlement Agreement in this proceeding (attached as Appendix A to the decision).

OP 2, states,

The Joint Motion for Adoption of Settlement Agreement, filed July 12, 2024, is granted, and the Settlement Agreement attached to this decision as Appendix A is approved and adopted.

Additionally, the revised tariff schedules that are being submitted in this advice letter are in compliance with OP 10 in D.25-01-036, which states,

Golden State Water Company is authorized to include the surcharges from the following in its Tier 1 advice letter implementing tariff schedules resulting from the instant decision: (1) Customer Assistance Program Balancing Account; (2) Pension and Benefits Balancing Account; (3) Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account - Emergency Disaster Relief Customer Outreach; (4) Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account - COVID-19; (5) Los Osos Basin Management Committee Memorandum Account; (6) Basin Pumping Rights Litigation Memorandum Account; (7) Aerojet Water Litigation Memorandum Account; (8) Clearlake Supply Expense Balancing Account; (9) General Ratemaking Area Balancing Account; (10) San Luis Obispo Valley Groundwater Basin Memorandum Account; (11) Public Safety Power Shutoff Memorandum Account; (12) Polyfluoroalkyl Substances Memorandum Account; (13) Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account - Extreme Heat Event; (14) 2021 Water Conservation Memorandum Account; (15) Drinking

Water Fees Balancing Account; (16) Santa Maria Steelhead Recovery Plan Memorandum Account; and (17) Los Osos Groundwater Adjudication Memorandum Account.

COMPLIANCE

This advice letter reflects GSWC's full compliance with all the directives in the Ordering Paragraphs listed above, as it pertains to Region 1.

EFFECTIVE DATE

As provided in D.25-01-036, GSWC may implement the 2025 tariff changes requested in this advice letter via a Tier 1 filing. GSWC requests that the revised tariff schedules become effective February 1, 2025.

NOTICING

This is a Tier 1 advice letter that does not require customer notice, as provided in Water Industry Rule 7.3.1 of General Order 96-B. However, GSWC will notify Region 1 customers of their rate change by placing a message on the first water bill after the 2025 water rates go into effect.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this Advice Letter (AL). When submitting a response or protest, please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the

utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Water Division (WD) must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, **please include** the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform WD, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

REPLIES

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by WD within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96-B.

- 2. New Services: Contra Costa Water District (CCWD) imposes a Facilities Reserve Charge for new or enlarged Retail services in this district. An applicant for service must first pay this fee, if applicable, to CCWD before service will be rendered under this schedule.
- 3. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, a surcharge of \$0.166 per Ccf will be applied to all metered customer bills excluding customers that are receiving the CAP credit. This surcharge will offset the CAP credits and CAP administrative program costs recorded in the CAP Balancing Account.
- 4. As authorized by Rule 9.1.e. for customers with more than one meter on a single service line, the customer's service charge rate is based on a factor multiplied by the service charge applicable to the nearest standard meter size of the combined meters as determined by the equivalent diameter methodology.
- 5. Non-residential Sprinkler rates can be added as needed utilizing the multiplication factors identified in Appendix F of D. 17-03-001, applied to the 5/8" meter charge.
- 6. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.198 per Ccf based on a 12-month amortization period, is to be added to the Quantity Rate, beginning on May 1, 2024 as indicated in Advice Letter 1938-WA. The surcharge may be recalibrated annually, if necessary. This surcharge will recover the under collection in the WRAM/MCBA Balancing Account.

As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission in D.23-06-024, an amount of \$0.565 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 36-months, beginning on October 10, 2023.
